Report on 2003 CPTED Ontario Conference

“Eyes and Feet on the Street” By Dorinda Howe

On Sunday, October 19th, Marian Hultgreen, Craig Dorris and I went to the reception for the attendees of the CPTED Ontario conference. We were greeted by Tom McKay, Chairman of CPTED Ontario, and John Periversoff, the conference chairman. We were introduced to CPTED Ontario members from all over the province.

On Monday the conference began and the theme was introduced: “Eyes and Feet on the Street”. The theme was chosen to keep everyone focused on the absolute need for community in our application of CPTED. “Reduction of fear, improvement in quality of life ensures that people do not simply remain balkanized pockets, but rather cohere

in a vibrant caring entity – the community.”

Some of the workshops presented included: Lighting, Risk Management and CPTED, Spatial Sequencing, Safety Audits, Deterring Smash and Grab, Color, and Applying CPTED to Shopping Malls. 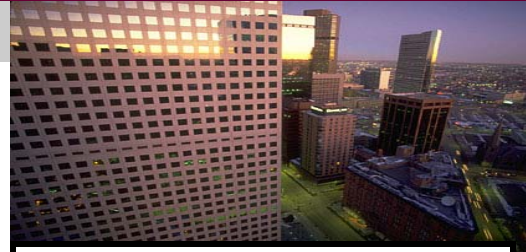

September 19, 2003 quarterly meeting minutes

The third general meeting of the year was held at the Orlando International Airport. Carolyn Fennell, from OIA Public Administration, gave FCN members an extensive and very interesting historical background of the airline industry and OIA changes over the years. In its beginning years, OIA looked very different from its present setup with only 4 airlines, 1 concourse. The present cargo building was the airport back then. So, many changes has taken place for the better over the years partly due to airline deregulation and also thanks to proper planning and foresight.

Fennell advised that there are three elements in design criteria that were considered and configured into OIA's design: 1. The airport must be able to expand quickly 2. It needs to be convenient 3. The airport needs to look like FL complete with palm trees and real plants, In

addition, the airport was built based on what the public wants, such as carpeting on the floor and groups of chairs for families to sit together. All this planning speaks for itself with OIA being the fastest growing airport in the nation, the 28th largest airport in the world and the third largest in the country. Last year, OIA handled approximately 26.7 million people, which is more domestic traffic in the entire state of Florida.

Chief Pete Gauntlett gave members a rare look into the inner workings of OIA and how CPTED principles have been incorporated into current security proce-

dures. FCN Board and FCN members were treated to a tour of baggage screening areas and also to a delicious breakfast spread. Many thanks to OIA administration for the hospitality.

In Memory Of Art S. Walls: May 11, 1950—February 10, 2000

As many of you are aware, Dorinda Howe has been working on the details of implementing an FCN scholarship program. Many thanks to Dorinda for her hard work on this endeavor. After much discussion on a possible name for the program, the FCN Board felt that it would be a fitting tribute if the name would honor the memory of one of the founding members of the Florida CPTED Network, Police Officer Art Walls. This program has now been officially named The Florida CPTED Network Art Walls Training Assistance Program. Many of our FCN members never had the pleasure of meeting Art or sitting under his tutelage. So, the FCN Board would like to honor Officer Walls life and career in this issue of The CPTED Planner.

Arthur "Art" S. Walls is best remembered for his dedication to the field of crime prevention and love for the citizens of Sarasota, Florida. Art began his love of Sarasota on May 3, 1976 when he was sworn in as a police officer. His law enforcement career began with the Long Branch Police Department in his birth state of New Jersey following a four-year tour of duty in Viet Nam as a member of the US Navy. As a member of the Sarasota Police

Department Art dedicated himself to crime prevention and the advancement of safety and security measures to citizens throughout Florida. He was an instructor with the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute (FCPTI) of the Florida Attorney General's Office starting in 1982. Art was one of the principals involved in the institution of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) into design reviews for the City of Sarasota. As an instructor Art trained hundreds of Florida police officers and deputy sheriffs in the art of CPTED. Additionally, Art was responsible to conduct security surveys, coordinated the neighborhood watch program and business watch program as well as conducting prevention programs at Sarasota schools.

Another avenue Art used to bring crime prevention methods and networking to other police agencies was the Suncoast Crime Prevention Association, the Florida Crime Prevention Association (FCPA) and the Florida CPTED Network (FCN). He was one of the founding members of the Florida CPTED Network and was a key figure in those early establishment meetings. At one point in time he was president of all three organizations.

When Art passed away, he was in Sebring, Florida con-

ducting training for the FCPTI ensuring a new generation of crime prevention officers could properly serve the citizens of Florida. In recognition of his dedication to crime prevention and commitment to this community, the Suncoast Crime Prevention Association created the Arthur S. Walls award to recognize a member of the Suncoast Crime Prevention Association who portrayed a level of dedication to the field of crime prevention and commitment to their home community.

The Florida CPTED Network Art Walls Training Assistance Program

The *Art Walls Training Assistance Program* is designed to assist members of the organization with funding needed to attend training sessions that may otherwise be unobtainable.

The following criteria must be met to ensure a review of the request by the FCN Board of Directors:

1. The applicant must have been an active member of the Florida CPTED Network for a minimum of one year prior to submitting a request for training assistance.
2. The applicant must have attended at least two (2) FCN meetings within the 12-month period prior to submitting a request.
3. The applicant's primary job should be CPTED related.
4. The applicant's agency (where applicable) must be in good standing and annual dues paid.
5. All applicants will submit a Letter Of Consideration detailing the type of training, who is supplying the training/conference, what they hope to obtain from the training, and a statement of why they would like to attend the training accompanied by the training / conference brochure and registration form when possible. All letters must be received at least 60 days prior to the training registration deadline.
6. A signed letter from the applicant's chief, sheriff, department head or his/her designee explaining the agency's lack of training funds must accompany the applicant's Letter Of Consideration for the training assistance program.
7. The training must be CPTED oriented to enhance the applicants CPTED skills.
8. Each member is limited to one (1) tuition assistance per year.
9. Each agency is limited to two (2) tuition assistance per year regardless of agency size.
10. Scholarships are primarily for tuition / registration fees only and may not exceed \$500.
11. The Florida CPTED Network will pay tuition/registration directly to the training/conference facility when possible.
12. Upon completion of the training / conference, the person receiving the funding may be required to conduct a training session/presentation at one of the general meetings.

The FCN Board of Directors will review all applications meeting the required criteria and make a final decision. All requests for assistance will be mailed directly to the FCN Treasurer, Denis Volkerson at Orange County Sheriff's Office, 6544 Carrier Drive, Orlando, FL 32819.

Directions To Orange County Sheriff's Office Training Facility



Directions to the Orange County Sheriff's Office Training Center From the East:

Take I-4 West (towards downtown Orlando) to Exit 29 (Sand Lake Rd). Turn left onto Sand Lake Rd. Go 3.6 miles crossing over John Young Parkway. You will go up an overpass and on the other side, at the bottom of the hill, is a traffic light. Turn right at the traffic light. A small sign is on the corner for the OCSO training center. Follow the road around the bend and take a right onto Exchange Drive. Go past a small lake to the first set of office buildings on the right. There will be a sign for OCSO training center at the entrance to the office complex. Turn right at the first entrance and go to the back. Turn left and training center is on the left. See map for the exact location of the training center off of Sand Lake Rd. The address is 8256 Exchange Dr., Orlando, FL 32809

To OCSO Training Center Traveling From the West:

Take I-4 East to the Beeline Expressway

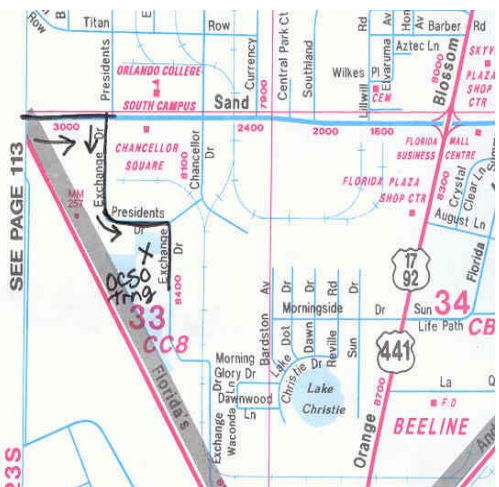
(Exit 28). Go east on the Beeline to the John Young Parkway exit North (2nd JY Pkwy exit). Go north on the John Young to the intersection at Sand Lake Rd. Turn right onto Sand Lake. You will be going up an overpass. At the bottom of the overpass there is a traffic light. Turn right at the traffic light (a small sign for the OCSO training center is on the corner). Follow the road around the bend and take a right onto Exchange Dr. Go past a small lake to the first set of office buildings on the right. There will be a sign for OCSO training center at the entrance to the office complex. Turn right at the first entrance and go to the back. Turn left and the training center is on the left. See map for the exact location of the training center off of Sand Lake.

From the Turnpike:

Take I-4 East toward downtown Orlando and exit at John Young Parkway (Exit 32). Turn right onto John Young Parkway going south to Sand Lake Road. Turn left onto Sand Lake Rd. You will go up an overpass. At the bottom of the overpass

there is a traffic light. Turn right at the traffic light (a small sign for OCSO training center is on the corner). To continue on to the training center, follow directions above in italics and refer to the map.
